

Structure and Resources


## Introduction

The statistics shown in this Chapter concern the organization of the central headquarters (Farnesina) and the overall network abroad (Embassies, Permanent Missions, Consulates, Special Diplomatic Representations and Italian Cultural Institutes), as well as the Ministry's human and financial resources.


**Organization.** According to the reform of 2000 the structure of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs consists now of 13 Directorates General, 4 Services and other articulations dedicated to specific tasks, as seen in the following chart:




There have been no significant variations in the network abroad, as compared with the previous year: the number of Embassies (123), Consulates (116) and Italian Cultural Institutes (93) has remained the same (Fig. 1.1).




As regards the territorial distribution of the Embassies (Fig. 1.2) it can be seen that 45 (36% of total) are located in Europe, while the remaining 78 (64%) are distributed almost uniformly among the other four geographical areas (17% in the Americas, 15% in the Mediterranean and Middle East, 18% in Sub-Saharan Africa and 14% in Asia and Oceania).



By comparison, the territorial distribution of the Consulates is different (Fig. 1.3): 60 of them (52% of the total) are located in Europe, 32 (28%) in the Americas, 12 (10%) in Asia and Oceania area, 8 (7%) in Mediterranean and Middle East and, finally, 4 (3%) in Sub-Saharan Africa.



As regards the Italian Cultural Institutes (Fig. 1.4) it can be seen that 49 (53%) are located in Europe, 19 (20%) in the Americas, 10 in Mediterranean and Middle East (11%), 3 in Sub-Saharan Africa (3%) and 12 in Asia and Oceania (13%).



**Human resources.** The Ministry of Foreign Affairs avails itself of the services of 8 056 persons, 5 300 of whom are permanent staff, 2 244 locally engaged staff abroad, and 512 experts and employees from other Ministries. There are 2 886 persons working in the central headquarters and 5 170 abroad.





Figure 1.5 – Total staff abroad by geographical area (2003)

Personnel abroad (Fig. 1.5), working in Embassies, Consulates and Permanent Missions, included locally engaged staff, are located 49% in Europe, 22% in the Americas, 11% in Asia and Oceania, 10% in Mediterranean and Middle East and 8% in Sub-Saharan Africa.





Figure 1.7 – MFA Budget (1985-2004)

**Financial resources.** Since the late 90's the MFA Budget has been showing an increasing trend. In 2004, the budget allotted to the MFA is 2 203 million Euro, equal to 0.34% of the national budget, but without the Official Development Assistance (ODA) funds, this figure drops to 1 587 million Euro, equal to only 0.24% of the national budget (Fig. 1.7 and 1.8).
