2. Objectives

2.1 Overall Objective(s):

To contribute to the preparation of Turkey for the future implementation of the Common Agricultural Policy of EU in the field of cross compliance system.

2.2 Project purpose:

To establish a cross compliance system that will link agricultural supports for farmers to compliance with statutory management requirements related to all the elements of the cross compliance including public, animal and plant health, animal welfare as well as environmental protection by developing relevant standards in line with EU legislation, raising awareness among farmers and checking the compliance of farmers to the standards set.

2.3 Contribution to National Development Plan/Cooperation agreement/Association Agreement/Action Plan

In the 10th National Development Plan, it is stated that one of the objectives is to extend environment friendly practices and ensure sustainability in the use of natural resources. The Measure will contribute to this objective.

In the Final Report of "Technical Assistance for the MoFAL for the design of a functioning Integrated Administration and Control System (IACS) and a Land Parcel Identification System (LPIS) in Turkey" (TR0402.08/002) Project, it is recommended that cross compliance provisions have to be respected by farmers receiving direct payments in order to ensure food safety, good agricultural conditions, environmental care and animal welfare altogether issues consumers and taxpayers are interested in.

In the Strategy Paper "Preparing a strategy regarding Identification of Agricultural Lands and how to develop the National Farmer Registration System", it is stated that "respecting cross compliance will be the main issue justifying the continued yearly support payments for the farmers. In line with EU conditions statutory management requirements and good agricultural and environmental condition must be respected by farmers on all agricultural areas of his farm

even if no direct payments have been claimed for these areas. The farmers have to know what they have to respect and must therefore get information from MoFAL. In this line, dissemination of consciousness over the farmers will have vital importance.

In the 2014 progress report of Turkey it is stated that regarding direct support to producers, Turkey has made no further steps towards drafting a strategy for adjusting its agricultural support policy in line with the common agricultural policy (CAP). The agricultural budget for 2014 continues to increase. Turkey has started to develop its land parcel identification system, a key component of the integrated administration and control system. The measure will contribute to the development of direct supports and as a component of establishment of IACS in Turkey.

Furthermore, although Turkey has already implemented legislation covering many fields which farmers have to respect under cross compliance obligations further elaboration is required since control and compatibility of these rules with the acts enumerated in the Council Regulation (EC) 1306/2013 lack behind. With the introduction of necessary legislation in line with EU acquis, especially on Statutory Management Requirements (SMR) and Good Agricultural and Environmental Conditions (GAEC) further checks with respect to cross compliance conditions shall be defined and awareness of farmers about their obligations shall be increased."

3. Description

3.1. Background and justification:

Agriculture is one of the most important sectors in the Turkish economy both in terms of its share in total GDP (10.1 % in 2010) and employment (about 24,7 % of the whole labour force in 2010).

A large fraction of the rural population in Turkey is employed on subsistence and semisubsistence farms. This implies that EU accession will have economic and social impacts on the Turkish Agriculture. As already described in several Progress Reports and document prepared by the European Commission services titled "The Issues Arising from Turkey's Membership Perspective" dated on 6th October 2004, Turkey aims to prepare the agricultural sector and its administration for accession.

Cross-compliance is regulated by Council Regulation (EC) No 1306/2013 and Commission Regulation 640/2014.

The rules on cross-compliance shall consist of the statutory management requirements under above mentioned regulations and the standards for good agricultural and environmental condition of land established at national level as listed in Annex II of 1306/2013, relating to the following areas:

- (a) environment, climate change and good agricultural condition of land;
- (b) public, animal and plant health;
- (c) animal welfare.

As cross compliance is the main issue in the reform development of recent years in the EU and as it needs great efforts to implement the understanding of farmers for this issue it is

justified to request the support from IPA funds for the alignment of Turkish legislation and administration to EU CAP. It can be seen as an institution building part and is best organized in a twinning approach.

Under this measure, national legislation establishing a basis for cross compliance will be elaborated in alignment, with relevant EU legislation, through the preparation of draft legislation and if required proposals for legislative amendments. Furthermore, a cross compliance implementation plan will be prepared, and procedures to control the respect of cross compliance rules by farmers, including rules for penalization in case of incompliance (exclusion of farmers from agricultural support schemes and deductions from direct payments to farmers) will be elaborated. Informative material to be distributed to farmers shall be prepared for raising awareness. The measure not only provides input for mandatory cross compliance including animal welfare and food safety as aforementioned in the Annex II of Council Regulation (EC) No 1306/2013 but also for optional agri-environment measures implemented under rural development, including those under IPARD.

In addition, single farm payment activities and measures to control the justification of the payments and to prevent fraud require participatory approach therefore awareness raising campaign and capacity building of the relevant stakeholders i.e., MoFAL staff, institutions, local authorities and NGOs, are going to be carried out under this measure.

According to the Turkish administrative system, a by-law has to be enacted for the implementation of IACS / LPIS. Single farm payment activities and measures to control the justification of the payments and to prevent fraud require participation and training of the MoFAL staff, institutions, local authorities and NGO's as far as they are involved in cross compliance procedures. Therefore, these institutions should closely accompany this measure. There is no doubt that staff working on IACS/LPIS has to be trained to make efficient use of these two managerial tools.

In this sense, this measure is a follow up exercise using the methodology developed in the previously mentioned project (Project TR0402.08/0002) for the implementation of IACS / LPIS throughout the country, as well. It will help Turkey to implement a functioning integrated administration and control system in line with Council Regulation (EC) No 1306/2013 and Commission Regulations (EC) 640/2014 and 809/2014.

Finally, this measure intends to

- elaborate a review of all Turkish laws establishing a basis for cross compliance
- approve whether and how far these laws are compatible with EU legislation comprising 20 community legislative acts for statutory management requirements
- elaborate proposals for legislative adjustments and information sheets to make farmers aware of their obligations and
- implement procedures to control the respect of the cross compliance conditions by the farmers including rules for exclusion and deductions from the direct payments to the farmers not complying.

Activity 3.1. Training of the MoFAL staff, institutions, local authorities and NGO's as far as they are involved in cross compliance procedures as single farm payment activities and measures to control the justification of the payments and to prevent fraud require participation, Nearly 500 persons who are involved in cross compliance procedures will be trained within this activity under the leadership of RTA and the short term experts whom have good communication skills and experience in organisation and implementation of training sessions organised by Member States or by Community institutions directed towards staff members and have experience in the field of cross-compliance. The trainees are mostly composed of agricultural engineers, veterinarians, agricultural technicians. The institutions and NGOs will be further determined by the beneficiary.

Activity 3.2. Development and execution of an information campaign addressing to the administration and farmers.

Tasks of the Resident Twinning Adviser:

As to the general responsibility of the day-to-day implementation of the Twinning project in the Beneficiary Country, the Resident Twinning Adviser (RTA) tasks will include:

• To provide technical advice and assist the administration or other public sector bodies in the BC in the context of a predetermined work-plan.

- Coordination of all project activities and experts inputs in the country;
- Ensuring day-to-day implementation of the Twinning project in the BC.
- Ensuring smooth correlation between the activities, deadlines and the envisaged results in the Work Plan;
- Taking corrective actions, if necessary, inside the terms of the signed contract.

In addition to the abovementioned general responsibilities, the RTA will be responsible for the execution of activities related to Cross-compliance, including the following tasks:

- To assist in the preparation of all project documents related to Cross-compliance;
- To coordinate and organize training activities related to Cross-compliance;
- To provide advice on review and upgrade the relevant Law on agriculture and rural development and related laws and assist and guide in the drafting of additional relevant by-laws and Manuals of procedures, protocols and written procedures for the work posts and various sets of documents related to control, and supervision systems;
- To execute the analysis of the existing institutional set-up and training needs assessments and guide the training delivery;
- To provide assistance to competent authority in the education, training and dissemination of information to potential beneficiaries of the SMR and GAEC;
- To coordinate closely with the STE's the implementation of project activities related to Cross-compliance;
- 3.5.3 Profile and tasks of the short-term experts

Short-Term Experts will:

- have a university-level degree or an equivalent of 10 years of relevant professional
- experience in the field of cross-compliance
- have experience in elaboration of guidebooks and manuals for training
- be civil servants or equivalent staff seconded to work within departments/units related to Cross-compliance in a Member State;
- have a permanent position within departments/units related to cross-compliance.
- have good communication skills and experience in organisation and implementation of training sessions organised by Member States or by Community institutions directed towards staff members and/or operators in the scope of the project;
- full computer literacy, excellent command of written and spoken English.

4. Institutional Framework

MoFAL has the duty to implement the next steps of technical assistance for setting up IACS/LPIS in whole Turkey. Main beneficiary of this Project will be the General Directorate of Agricultural Reform (GDAR) Integrated Administration and Control System (IACS) Department MoFAL-GDAR is the main responsible body for administration related to the preparation, tendering and implementation of this project.

The SPO of the measure will be Mr. Dr. Gürsel KÜSEK, General Director of General Directorate of Agricultural Reform (GDAR). His main responsibility is to maintain the coordination between the components of the measure.

Department of Integrated Administration and Control System (IACS) under General

Directorate of Agricultural Reform (GDAR) will be the Project Management Unit (PMU) and will be responsible for assuring effective co-ordination of the measure as well as monitoring and reporting during the implementation phase, and provide technical and administrative support for management. PMU is also responsible for implementing the measure on behalf of MoFAL.

A Steering Committee (SC) will be established by the relevant institutions in terms of integration into the cross compliance implementations. So, SC will be composed of the SPO, representatives from Integrated Administration and Control System Department, General Directorate of EU Foreign Relations, Office of Legal Counsellor of MoFAL, Ministry of Environment, representative of Ministry for EU Affairs, General Directorate of Food and Control - Department for Animal Health and Quarantine, representative of Union of Turkish Chambers of Agriculture (TZOB). The CFCU and the European Union Delegation (EUD) to Turkey will participate in the steering committee meetings as observers.

The Steering Committee receives and comments all work plans and reports on the implementation of the measure. The Steering Committee acts as adviser and arbitrator if any difficulties in program implementation are encountered. Appropriate reporting from meetings are established and disseminated by the Project Management Unit. Each Steering Committee will meet at least four times a year and will be chaired by the SPO.

For monitoring of project management and activities, the beneficiary will prepare the monitoring reports and will submit them to the National Aid Coordinator (NAC).

8. Sustainability

The measure is complementary to 2004 project fiche (TR04.02.08 001 and 002) on Preparation for the Implementation of EU Common Agricultural Policy (CAP).

In order to ensure sustainability of the developed systems, MoFAL prepared and submitted a Strategy Document, as a formal commitment towards this ultimate goal. Content of the governmentally approved Strategy document are shaped in compliance with the comments of EC authorities. Strategy provides a commitment on the future maintenance and sustainability of the system.

Activities will take into account the compatibility between the CAP/IACS and Turkey's national agricultural support programmes to ensure that all components are relevant and for the use and improvement of Turkey's national support programmes.

The IACS and LPIS are dynamic by nature and so MoFAL will be required to have a body of experts at central and provincial level, able to assimilate future modifications as well as guiding colleagues.

9. Crosscutting issues (equal opportunity, environment, etc...)

9.1. Equal Opportunity

Participation in this measure will be open to both males and females involved in the sector. Records of professionals' participation in all activities will reflect this and will be kept with the measure documentation.

9.2. Environment

This measure will help to protect the environment and sustainable use of natural resources by creating public consciousness. By the legislative studies affective protection and control will be obtained on waters and soils against to nutrient pollution. Environmental, climate change and biodiversity issues are elaborated and these measure foresees legislative alignment and raising awareness among farmers.
